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GENERAL ORDINANCE

1. BY COUNCIL PRESIDENT KHADER, MAJORITY LEADER SABATINO, MINORITY LEADER BREEN, COUNCILMEMBERS WILLIAMS, PINEDA-ISAAC, RUBBO AND MERANTE:

A GENERAL ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO EXTENDING THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE APPROVAL OF HOTEL USES IN THE SOUTH BROADWAY DISTRICT PENDING APPROPRIATE REVIEW

The City Council of the City of Yonkers, in City Council convened, does hereby ordain and enact as follows:

Section 1. Statement of legislative purpose and finding. The City Council of the City of Yonkers (the "**City Council**") hereby reiterates its concerns about the impact that hotels have on residential neighbors of the South Broadway District as stated in General Ordinance 3-2019 adopted by the City Council on March 12, 2019 establishing a temporary moratorium on the approval of hotel uses in the South Broadway District pending appropriate review (the "**Temporary Moratorium**"). The Temporary Moratorium further provided that the moratorium period may be extended an additional 180 days if deemed necessary by the City Council to complete the study and prepare the recommendations.

Section 2. A qualified consultant was retained to collaborate with the City of Yonkers Department of Planning and Development to conduct a study and prepare recommendations as described in General Ordinance 3-2019. Having been informed by City staff that limited amount of additional time is needed for a thorough and reliable study of the situation, the City Council finds it appropriate and necessary to extend the time imposed by General Ordinance 3-2019 by an additional 180 days beyond the initial 180 day moratorium period.

Section 3. The extension of the Temporary Moratorium is a Type II action under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("**SEQR**") and therefore requires no further review under SEQR.

Section 4. The Temporary Moratorium is hereby extended for the purpose of completing the studying and preparing recommendations as described in General Ordinance 2019-3. All terms and conditions of the Temporary Moratoriums shall remain in full force and effect.

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GENERAL ORDINANCE (CONTINUED)

Section 5. The Temporary Moratorium shall be extended for an additional 180 days, effective upon the expiration of the initial 180 day moratorium period.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, it is estimated that there are 25 times the number of attempted suicides than completed suicides; and

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention reported that 60% of high school students claimed that they had thought about committing suicide, and around 9% of them said that they tried killing themselves at least once; and

WHEREAS, according to a study by the National Conference of State Legislatures, 19.3% of high school students have seriously considered killing themselves, 14.5% of high school students made actual plans for committing suicide, and approximately 900,000 youth planned their suicides during an episode of major depression; and
